

PISTOLPACKING PEPSI

Pistolpacking Pepsi had a stellar career in Indiana. The once Quarter Horse of the Year in the Hoosier state competed from 2013 through the 2017 season all under the direction of trainer Ron Brown, who co- owned the horse with Robert Ray.

Recognizable by the big white patch on his left flank, Pistolpacking Pepsi burst onto the scene at two and finished up the year with a win in the Miss Roxie Little Futurity. He returned at three to reel off five straight wins which included titles in the Blue River Derby, the Indiana Stallion Derby and the Sterlie Bertram Memorial. As an older horse, the son of Jesse James Jr. kept right on scoring wins, posting victories in the Bob Woodard Stakes and a stakes record setting effort in the Hoosier Park Classic. In all, Pistolpacking Pepsi won 12 races in 38 starts with an additional 12 finishes in the top three. His earnings amount of \$451,703 ranks him among the top five all-time leading Quarter Horses in the state of Indiana.
