

# WRANGLERS BEAT (IN)



Wranglers Beat was born on March 31, 1992 into a family deeply entrenched in Quarter Horse Racing in Indiana. His breeders and early owners were QHRAI Hall of Famer Mike and Mary J Renihan, he was by QHRAI Hall of Fame Indiana Sire Born Runner, and out of the Tiny Circus mare Sweet Tiny Beat. In the 90s, Hoosier Park in Anderson, Indiana was just being built, and parimutuel quarter horse racing had not yet been established in the state. The Quarter Horse Racing Association of Indiana advocated for Indiana bred and/or sired foals to have opportunities to race in the surrounding states – this included Beulah Park in Ohio, Mount Pleasant Meadows in Michigan, Prairie Meadows in Iowa, and Pit Run Park in Illinois. Wranglers Beat would go on to be a stakes winner and multiple stakes placed in the six years he ran from 1994-1999 (many times in the winner circle with QHRAI Hall of Fame jockey Carter Riley), trained by Randy Haffner, and the Renihan's as owners for his futurity and derby years then Randy and Lynn Haffner for the rest of his racing career. His stats speak for themselves, but the most notable was when he was awarded AQHA Superior Race Horse in 1997.
